

Ilene Jaroslaw Appointed Council Member of the ABA's Criminal Justice Section

She was named a 2018 Woman Worth Watching by *Profiles in Diversity Journal* and was appointed earlier this year to *Law360's* Editorial Advisory Board for White Collar Crime.
